4.1 Description of first aid measures

General notes

Do not induce vomiting! Rinse mouth thoroughly with water. Drink plenty of water in small sips. In case of doubt or if feeling unwell seek medical help. Show the physician the safety data sheet or label. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If vomiting occurs, the patient should hold the head lower than the hips, because it reduces the possibility of aspiration.

Following inhalation
